RULES & REGULATIONS

(updated August 2021)

The KSC adheres to the Skate Canada Rules. The following is in addition to those rules and it is expected that every skater and their parent(s)/guardian respect and follow the rules as they are written. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action by the Club and it's Executive and possible expulsion from the program. Please remember these rules are in place only for the betterment of the skaters' safety and learning in their training environment.

1. No gum chewing or eating allowed on the ice.
2. No sitting or lying on the ice.
3. Proper skating attire is mandatory. If you are not sure, ask a Coach for assistance in selecting something that is suitable and warm. No long scarves, extremely baggy pants or long dresses are allowed. Long hair must be tied back. Gloves or mitts and CSA approved helmets for pre-school and beginner CanSkaters are mandatory based on Skate Canada Policy.
4. No one is permitted on the ice with street footwear. Skates only; Parents may not set foot on the ice.
5. Coaches are not to be interrupted on the ice. Any questions must be asked after the session or check with your Coach for appropriate times to call.
6. No parent or unauthorized person may teach, aid or instruct on the ice or from the stands. Viewing privileges may be revoked if this rule is not adhered to. Preschool and CanSkate Parents are asked to stay in the stands, unless asked by coaching staff to be at the boards.
7. Each skater must be aware of every skater on the ice. Intimidation or disrespect for other skaters and unsafe skating practices will not be tolerated. Yield right of way to skaters in lessons and those skating their solos.
8. Skaters must ask permission from their Coach to leave the ice during any session. Once skaters set foot off the ice, they are the responsibility of the parent, not the coaches/club.
9. Parent concerns will be addressed after classes have concluded. Please choose an off-ice moment to discuss concerns. Name calling, abusive language, or any conduct that is deemed aggressive or intimidating in nature towards any club members, will lead to parents having their change room and viewing privileges revoked.
